The State of Texasandates that threat assessments must be conducted when students display harmful, threatening, or violent behavior which includes threats of selfarm, bullying, cyberbullying, fighting, the use or possession of a weapon, sexual assault, sexual harassment, dating violence, asking, or assault [TEC 37.115(a)(1)]

Threat assessments are a npunitive process of investigating the risk for violence o self and/or othersand areas of concern.

Individualized interventions are developed based on demonstrated need.


